Boom! Sounding out the enemy

would be set up at Kemmel Hill, south of the village of Ypres (EE-pruh), in neighboring Belgium. That area would see some of the worst fighting in this war. How sound ranging worked. To accurately record the time it took for a gun's boom to reach each microphone, Bragg and his colleagues decided to use a technique developed by Lucien Bull.
